Does God Expect Us (Christians) To Tithe?

Do you know that in the New Testament there is no command, decree, dictate, directive of obligation for tithing? It's true! We are under no such obligation. But there are those that force their members to tithe, mostly in the multiple cups. This shows how people have misread the passages of the Bible. Tithing was part of the Old Testament and is no longer in force under the New Testament. Jesus fulfilled the Old Law by blotting it out and replacing it with the New Law. *"Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross; and having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it."* (Col.2:14-15). Tithing was part of that Old Law which was taken out of the way. You find that some denominational groups still insist that people must tithe!

In the New Testament we are to:

- Give as we have been prospered. *"Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him, that*

there be no gathering when I come." (1 Cor. 16:2). We don't find tithing in the New Testament.

- Give as we have purposed in our heart. *"Every man according as he purposed in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver."* (2 Cor. 9:7). "God loveth a cheerful giver" Not a cheerful tither.
- We are not to give grudgingly. (2 Cor. 9:7).
- Nor are we to give because we must. (2 Cor. 9:7).

God has left it up to the individual to decide what his contribution will be and has given NO mandate based on percentage. It's our call. We are to give an amount that we choose and are comfortable with.

"Every man according as he purposed in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:7).

Jesus said this about our giving: *"Give and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over,*

shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal at shall be measured to you again.” (Luke 2:38). The same principle held true under the Old Testament when God told the Israelites: “Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessings, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.” (Mal. 3:10).

Again, the formal act of tithing is not in force under the New Testament. However, the

principal remains the same; the more we give to God, the more He gives to us; “*good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over.*” Our friends and neighboring churches must go back to the Bible and study by digging what God commands His people to do concerning giving. Not forcing members to tithe. However we are not disciples of Moses but of Christ. May God help His people with understanding of His word.

Report From Kenya

We thank God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior for everything we have so far done during this year 2018 that is almost coming to an end. We are very much thankful for brethren in U.S, who work with Bro. Ellis Forsman to make sure that the work of the Lord Jesus Christ continues to be felt around the world particularly in Africa. May God Our Father bless you all. We cannot forget to express our sincere gratitude toward the publication of *The Christian*

Currier for its update information for all congregations that use one cup for the Lord's table. The Lord's work in Kenya.

- **Evangelism:** We continue to preach and do much work as far as restoring the New Testament Church in most places where we are able to reach. This has been done effectively in Kakamega, Nakuru, Machakos and Naivasha where we have received positive reports on evangelism. Our plan is to reach to other places

with the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We have been receiving calls of invitation for us to visit Busia County. The report reached us through Bro. Laban. I have written to Bro. Ellis about the need to visit Busia and have meetings with brethren. Here we need financial support to be able fulfill the mission. There are congregations and brethren who are well known to us (Laban and I) We worked with them some many years ago when Boaz was still in Kenya and lived at Nambale.

- **NAKURU:** The congregation at Barut continues to grow. There are now about 28 members. Christians are very happy with what we have achieved, particularly the church property - the plot. We completed putting the fence around the premises and now we are putting up the latrine for the church. We had to contribute some money for the work. We needed a ksh.15,000/= about \$150 to construct the latrine. Soon there will be baptism which is underway.
- **KAKAMEGA:** There is good work going on in Kakamega. About eight congregations have agreed to work together and help each other. I wrote to Bro. Ellis about this unity.
- **The orphanage** reports which I wrote remain the same. Everyone is waiting for Bro. Gerald Brockman who promised to visit the orphanage next year, 2019.
- **Matundu:** Bro. Laban reported about the Matundu church where he said that to date they don't have a place to meet for worship. I witnessed this when I was there. They meet at Laban's home. There is a piece of land that Laban donated for the church
- **NAKURU:** As I had informed sometime back that Ronda Church of Christ which had before

been using multiple cups changed to one cup. They still work with us. Bro. William Odhiambo and Bro. Obare are the preachers now. Bro. Mathews Otieno left to work at his rural home near Butere. We are planning to visit him. This is a congregation called Mahondo Church of Christ.

- **NAIVASHA:** Bro. Thomas Situma sent the following : “The church is doing well. On 21st October, 2018, we baptized Wilson Syengo and he now is a member of the church. We also meet once at the mid-week fellowship.” Thanks Bro. Thomas Situma. The picture of Wilson Syengo's baptism will come to you as soon as it is ready.

From these four boys he was blessed with 14 Grandchildren and 9 Great-Grandchildren.

He was a master in the world of working with iron and joined and supported Jim in this industry. Jim and Frank worked together like a well-oiled machine. Frank spent his life supporting his sons in whatever they were doing whether it was welding, quarrying, mining for gold, or building a saw. Whatever they asked he helped. The goals and desires of his children superseded any of his own needs. The achievements of his children were the fulfillment he craved from this world.

He would give the shirt off his back to anyone who asked. Anything he received he used to help someone else. Many times he would bring people to church and try to help improve their lives through monetary assistance and with the word of God. He baptized many, many people throughout his life and of all the things he has achieved, for him, this was the most important achievement of all.

He worked every day of his life not just because he had to, but because he wanted to. He was a welder and fabricator by trade and could operate large equipment like a pro. He moved to Lueders to help Jim and Keelan start a new quarry. He stressed to his grandchildren to spend time with their families and stop and smell the roses occasionally. That there was more to life than work. He enjoyed his time working in a family business where he could interact with his family on a daily basis.

The only thing more important to Frank than his family was his love for God. He was a master in the knowledge of Christ. His mother was instrumental in bringing him to the Church and he spent his life studying, learning and teaching others the word of God. The church was the cornerstone of his life and the inspiration for his being. He has passed his faith on to his family.

So what does Frank leave behind? His knowledge, his faith, and the love of his family. He was the anchor of this family and he will be sorely missed. He was lovingly laid to rest Oct. 29, 2018, in Carlsbad, NM
