Respecting The Bible In Difficult Times

“The proud have forged a lie against me. But I will keep your precepts with my whole heart...Let the proud be a shamed, for they treated me wrongly with falsehood; But I will mediate on your precepts...They almost made an end of me on earth, But I did not forsake your precepts... I will never forget your precepts, for by them you have given me life.” (Psalms 119:69, 78, 87, 93).

When things in life become difficult, where do you turn? Maybe you go to a good friend, your parents, or to some other family member; or maybe you turn to a brother or sister in Christ, or to one of the church leaders. Certainly none of these choices would be wrong; but do these people, then, turn us toward the word of God? Too often we respect the Bible when things are going well, but then we are ready to lay it aside when difficulty arises. If we would think about what the Bible teaches, we would remember that God’s faithful have always had difficulties. Just think

about Moses, Abraham, Lot, the prophets, and most importantly, think about Jesus Christ. All of these faithful servants of God experienced extremely difficult periods in their lives. Yet, they all survived!

The Psalmist said that he had been lied about, treated perversely, was almost consumed, but through it all he refused to forsake the word of God. What was his reason for that strong conviction? *“For by them you have given me life”* (Psalms 119:93). The Psalmist knew that in God’s word he would find encouragement, strength, and guidance for the difficult times in his life.

What do we do when someone lies about us? What do we do when someone treats us in a shameful way? What do we do when it seems that our problems are about to consume us? Do we give up, get angry, quit the church, or do we cling ever stronger to the word of God?

In Matthew 4, when Jesus was being tempted by the devil, He resisted each

temptation by appealing to the written word of God. If our Lord found strength and comfort in the promises of God's word, surely that should be an example that we will want to follow.

The real test of our respect for the Bible often comes when the going gets rough. Let us have the determination of the Psalmist and regardless of what else may be going on in our

lives, let us remember that that one thing is certain: we will not turn away from God's word because in that word we know that we find eternal life.

Harlingen, TX (March)

I comment that my brothers of Guatemala invited me to work several days with some congregations where emerged divisional doctrine. I sent the brethren some studies so that they can understand the need of the evangelist workers, but they think that it is better that I personally visit Guatemala. For this reason I am making plans to travel to Guatemala during April. Thank you for your important help and prayers.

I travel during the next week to visit and work with the churches in Central Mexico.

Please receive all my gratefulness and my prayers, requesting the Lord give you brethren all the best. Remember that all effort for supporting the work of the Lord will not be in vain (1 Cor. 15:58).

I sent photos of the churches in Rio Verde, Mexico, eating a meal, and also a photo of Guatemala.

Harlingen, TX (May)

I comment that during April 8 - May 10, I traveled to Northern Guatemala to work with the churches (Coatepeque, Magnolla, Caserio, Villahermosa, and San Jose). In these churches there were some problems on The Lord's Supper, marriage, women speaking in the assembly and two cases of fornication (similar to what happened to the church in 1 Cor. 5:1-11 and Revelation 2:14-15). Also, a problem occurred with one congregation accepting as members in the church people who were not properly baptized as done by some other churches. With the help of the Lord and the humble respect of the brothers concerning the word of God, these problems were all corrected.

We had planned to visit churches in Quetzal and Pecul, but the police recommended that we not travel there because of the danger of assaults on those roads.

I comment that the trip in my car from Harlingen took 3 days.

I comment also that the brethren in other areas of the country invited us to work with them at some time. We plan visits to these areas in October & November, if the Lord permits.

In the return to Mexico, I visited and worked for 3 days with the brethren in Flower Top. The church building there was destroyed totally in 2018 from the earthquake in that area.

I comment that all of this work among these churches was accomplished with my wife and another evangelist.

I sent photos of the following churches: Coatepque, Magnolia, Caserio, Villahernosa, San Jose, and Flower Top.

Journey to Africa

Here is a summary of the journey to Africa by Bro. Ellis Forsman and Bro. Gerald Brockman (written by Ellis Forsman) March 21 – April 27, 2019.

- Wednesday, March 27: We arrived in Nairobi, Kenya. Bro. Sadat, Bro. John Kombo, with driver Dennis Ochieng picked Ellis & Gerald up at the airport. While in Nairobi, we purchased Bibles, grape juice, and bottled water before traveling to Naivasha where we spent the night.
- Thursday, March 28: Meeting with congregation at Naivasha. After meeting, brethren took us on a boat ride on Lake Naivasha where we saw a lot of hippos.
- Friday, March 29: We drove to Nakuru (home congregation of Bro. John Kombo). Brethren from Ronda congregation came to the morning and afternoon sessions of gospel meetings.
- Saturday, March 30: We drove to Kakamega where we were greeted by the children and staff of the orphanage. We started discussing orphanage business.
- Sunday, March 31: Church service at Kakamega. We traveled west toward Uganda with a stop in Western Kakamega County where we had a meeting with leaders from eight congregations with whom Bro. John Kombo and Bro. Benjamin Rono had been teaching. All eight congregations reported that they were joining their congregations with us. We then traveled on to Masafu, Uganda.
- Monday, April 1: We met Sis. Jesca Nakiwu for the first time. We had a business meeting at Masafu, then our driver took Gerald back to Kakamega to continue with discussions about the orphanage. Then we had a gospel meeting with the brethren at Masafu.
- Tuesday, April 2: Gospel meeting morning and afternoon at Masafu, then we traveled to Sio Port, Kenya.
- Wednesday, April 3: Gospel meeting at Sio Port where we met up with Bro. Milton Owanga. We also were glad to see Bro. John Odunga (sp?) who visited the meeting from just across the Uganda border near Sio Port, Kenya.
- Thursday, April 4: Gospel meeting at Sio Port. Then we traveled back to Kakamega and met up with Gerald and the orphanage leaders and children. We visited the future orphanage site just a few blocks from Bro. Laban Ambogo's home.
- Friday, April 5: Gospel meeting at Kakamega with church visitors attending from Adarema and Sibembe congregations.
- Saturday, April 6: Gospel meetings at Kakamega with church visitors attending from Adarema and Sibembe congregations. 18 people (young and old)

were baptized in the river less than a mile away.

- Sunday, April 7: Church service at Kakamega. Then Gerald traveled with us to Migori, Kenya, just shy of the Tanzania border. This leg of the trip took longer distance-wise than expected.
- Monday, April 8: Crossing the border into Tanzania had some issues with the car going into Tanzania, also there were some VISA issues to be dealt with. Also, we had a flat tire that had to be repaired.
- Tuesday, April 9: Gospel Meeting at Shirati with those gathering from Western Tanzania which totaled 99 people.
- Wednesday, April 10: We assembled for just a morning session at Shirati, and then we traveled back across the border into Kenya. More delays at the crossing. Also, a heavy thunderstorm appeared as we were going through the mountains. The road became a river; and the car stopped running in the middle of the road. After we finally got the car running again, we managed to find a place to sleep. Bro. John Kombo became very sick; I was worried that it was his heart.
- Thursday, April 11: We discovered that during the storm the previous night, we missed our turnoff to travel more directly to Nairobi where we needed to take Gerald to catch his flight back home. By the time this was discovered, we found we could not go back as we had already gone too far, so we kept on the northern route. We did manage to get Gerald to the airport in plenty of time to catch his flight back home.
- Friday, April 12: We took Bro. John Kombo to a hospital where it was diagnosed that his body had some kind of infection. We considered taking John to a relative's home in Nairobi, but John wanted to go on with us. His sickness got worse. We lost several hours, and were very late for the meeting in Arusha with members of congregations from places around Eastern Tanzania. We were so late many people gave up and went back to their homes. We had an assembly of very few people.
- Saturday, April 13: We traveled back across the border into Kenya and spent the night in Machakos Town.
- Sunday, April 14: We had church services in Machakos in the morning and in the afternoon, then a business meeting was called. Members of a visiting church announced that their congregation was joining us in worship services from that time on.
- Monday, April 15: I was taken to the airport where I flew to Monrovia, Liberia. I joined up with Bro. Suahgba and Bro. Logan. I was taken to a guest house (motel) in Buchanan where I spent every night while in Liberia.
- Tuesday, April 16 – Sunday, April 21: We drove each day to a separate church location for Gospel teaching and Church Services on Sunday (See letter from Bro. Suahgba for details).
- Monday, April 22: They took me to the airport at Monrovia where I started my long flight back home with a short stop with my daughter, Lori Harper & family, arriving in Lubbock, TX, on Saturday, April 27.

Report From East Tanzania

Hello brethern,

Many greetings to you, I am fine. I would just like to share with you some good news about the faith in Tabora town, I made a trip from Arusha to Tabora to preach and met some students who heard us some years ago. I left Arusha on Friday, and conducted a seminar on Saturday & Sunday, I taught about the (church history, i.e Stephano / James / Lidia, Phoeb, Peter, etc., how they worshiped God, how a Biblical church is organized (Elders/Deacons), Roles of ladies in the church, the 5 events that happened on the tree when Jesus was hanged / baptism-part 1/ 2/ 3, the Jewish calendar to which Jesus was begotten, tithing & instrument music, the Jewish Passover via Christ's passover (here I explained-the Bible doesn't have the so called Easter. While teaching this lesson I had carried a packets of grape juice plus a piece of unleavened bread. Finally I broke the bread and passed to them & the Cup (they were astonished too & drank from it).

During all the teachings I had the Graph Pictory which I showed & used when brother Ellis visited our plastic shade in Arusha last month.

The seminar was real nice and every one enjoyed and they appreciated it so much. After these two days of conducting the seminar, I went to Kigoma Town on Monday to see my

mama after 5 years, and back on Thursday to Tabora. I arrived at noon. Then at 5-7 pm I met them and taught about how the early church contributed giving, and answered some questions, then back to the lodge. Then I left yesterday at 6 am and arrived in Arusha at 6 pm.

These people have decided to leave the denominational belief, and start to worship like us. This is new and good news to God in Jesus name through the "Back to the Bible" in Arusha.

I have scanned and sent to you the picture of them. One is Lucas (an evangelist of the Anglican / the Episcopal sect) / Amos (kneeled down) was an African Inland Sect; others were like Pentecost's.

Let us pray for them. I had 4 packets of grape juice; I used two (poured into one cup for the communion – EPF) on Sunday. Now I have left over the other two to be used this next Sunday. I wanted them to know and see exactly how grape juice looks, and taught them how to bake unleavened bread.

Dear brethren, I have tried what I managed to do under God's blessing. Some look to get immersed soon. They will ring me so I can do it.

I can't do this alone since am I out of money for expenses, let us work together, Amen

Madeline passed away on May 12, 2019, at the age of 82 years. She lived in Texas all of her life. She was a faithful member of Christ's body for 57 years.

In 2006, she became a resident at The Plaza (a care facility). She rapidly became the un-official greeter to all new residents. She welcomed each new person and invited them to a church of Christ service held each Sunday afternoon. That group grew because of her effort. She also cleared tables, gathered crackers and bread to feed the birds, etc. She rarely took naps because there was always work to be done, all from a wheelchair.

When our mother, Sis. Nell McCay, entered The Plaza, Madeline welcomed her and she formed a deep, close bond with Nell, and later Sis. Reba White as well as many of us. She brought so much love and joy to all of us.

Every time a Courier was printed, Madeline read every word. Through all the articles and letters she got acquainted with all she read about. She prayed for all of you, although she never met you in person.

Madeline was lovingly laid to rest on May 16, 2019.

We are reminded of the Lord's words to His disciples about the woman pouring ointment on Him. His response to their frustration in Matt. 26:6 was, "She hath wrought a good work." We also remember the significance of just giving a cup of cold water in His name.

Both of these beautiful Christian ladies contributed so much to everyone around them. Many of you knew Jeannean, but only a few knew Madeline.

Both of these Christian sisters never stopped serving others, although in a wheel chair in a care facility.

Who We Are

We are a collection of congregations of the church of Christ who pattern our worship after the New Testament example of the church in the first century. We believe in the authoritative word of God in determining our doctrine and practice.

We do not tie ourselves to any other name but the name of Jesus Christ (Acts 4:10-12). Jesus Christ said, “*Upon this rock* (that is, the fact that He is the Son of God) *I will build my church*” (Matt. 16:18). Since the church belongs to Him, shouldn’t it bear His name, as well? The churches certainly did so in the first century. “*The churches of Christ salute you.*” (Rom. 16:16).

How We Worship

You will find each of the following activities in our worship each first day of the week:

Singing. No man-made instruments of music are used. As Christians, we are commanded to sing and make melody in our heart (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16). We feel it would be an addition to His will if we used instrumental instruments of music in the worship.

Teaching. The teaching is designed to instruct and encourage all of us in the way of righteousness (Acts 5:42; 2 Tim. 2:2).

The Lord's Supper. The communion is observed as it was when our Lord introduced it. The person attending the Lord's Table will give thanks for the bread, break it as the Lord did, and pass it on to the assembly to be eaten. This is done in remembrance of our Lord's broken body (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:23-24). The person attending the Lord's Table will also give thanks for the cup (singular) of the fruit of the vine and pass it to the assembly for them to partake of. This is done in remembrance of our Lord's shed blood.

Contribution. The collection is taken only on Sunday worship service. Each member gives as he purposes in his heart (1 Cor. 16:1-2).

Prayer. The prayers are designed to praise God and communicate our thoughts to Him.
