## Heaven The “Holiest”

(In the following scriptural quotations I have indicated the essential words and phrases with bold print in order to bring these to the reader’s attention.)

The book of Hebrews provides us with a beautiful picture of the role Jesus played in the redemption of mankind. Also we see, clearly revealed, the foreshadowing of this within the Law of Moses. This foreshadowing was, as the word implies, a shadow, but not the complete image. *“For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things...”* (Heb. 9:1).

We can clearly see the beginning of the rule of Christ over the Kingdom of God, with his claim of power over all things in heaven and earth.

Revealed also is the future concerning his promised return in victory over the final enemy, death. In this also we learn of our role in all this.

The time-span of all this begins with our Lord’s resurrection, continuing through his coming.

### Christ’s Body As Sacrifice

**1** **It was necessary that there be a sacrifice for our sins.** *“By the which will we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.”* (Heb. 10:10). **In this offering his blood was shed.** *“How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God.”* (Heb. 9:14).

**The foreshadowing of this was the high priest entering into the “Holy of Holies”.** *“...But into the second (tabernacle, tent) went the high priest alone once every year, not without blood, which he offered for himself, and for the errors of the people.”* (Heb. 9:7).

It was at this point, following the resurrection, that Jesus claimed the power to rule. “And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, **All power** is given unto me in heaven and in earth.” (Matt. 28:18).

**2** Jesus entered the “Holy Place” through a “veil” (curtain). “By a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, **through the veil**, that is to say, through his flesh.” (Heb. 10:20).

This was “shadowed” to us by the Levitical high priest once each year. “And after the second veil, the tabernacle which is called the holiest of all.” (Heb. 9:3).

“But into the second (tabernacle) went the high priest alone once every year...” (Heb. 9:7).

**3** The “Holy of Holies” that Jesus entered was heaven itself. “For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but **into heaven itself**, now to appear in the **presence of God** for us.” (Heb. 9:24).

The “type” of this was the high priest, entering once every year where he would be in the presence of God. “And let them make me a sanctuary; that I may dwell among them.” (Exo. 25:8). There was a “mercy seat” placed on the ark of the covenant and it was from above this that God spoke to the Israelites, concerning the law. (See Exo 25:22).

**4** Jesus was seated on the “right hand” of God. “But this man, (Jesus) after he had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God.” (Heb. 10:12).

We find in a prophecy by Daniel a foreshadowing of this. “...I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, (God) and they brought him

near before him. And there was given him dominion (power), and glory, and **a kingdom**, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed.” (Dan. 7:13-14).

**5** Having a “kingdom” suggests a “throne”. It was at the “right hand” of his Father that Jesus was seated on his throne. “Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would **raise up Christ** to sit on his throne...He seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ...This Jesus hath God raised up...Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted...The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand Until I make thy enemies thy footstool.” (Acts 2:30-35). This explains where David’s throne is situated.

**6** Christ is now reigning, seated at the “right hand” (signifying “power”) of God. “For **he must reign**, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.” (1 Cor. 15:25). The ancient practice of seating a prince on the right hand of the king is used to demonstrate the choice of an heir-apparent, chosen to be co-regent endowed with all power in the kingdom.

He is reigning over the kingdom given him by his Father (Ancient of days...See Dan. 7:13-14) He will continue to reign till all enemies are subdued. “But this man (Jesus), after he had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God; from henceforth (hereafter) expecting (awaiting) **till his enemies** be made his footstool.” (Heb. 10:12-13).

(The ESV makes it plainer, "...waiting from that time until his enemies should be made a footstool for his feet.")

It is obvious that we are living during the reign of Christ over his kingdom inasmuch as all enemies have not been vanquished. "*The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.*" (1 Cor. 15:26).

**7** The end of Christ's reign will come at the second coming of Christ at the resurrection. "*Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and all power.*" (1 Cor. 15:24).

This occurs simultaneously with the descent of Christ from heaven and the general resurrection. "*For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first. Then we which are alive shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so we shall ever be with the Lord.*" (1 Thess. 4:16-17).

All will be made alive. "*For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the first fruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming.*" (1 Cor. 15:22-23).

This will be the end of time as we know it (the "last time") "*Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, And saying, Where is the promise of his coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation.*" (2 Pet. 3:3-4).

## What This All Means To Us

Seeing that Jesus, by means of his death, entered into heaven, the "holiest" (the very presence of God), there reigning at the right hand of his Father, mankind can pass through the "veil" following the same steps. "*Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh; let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water.*" (Heb. 10:19-22).

Christ pointed the way. "...That by two immutable things, in which it was impossible for God to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold on the hope set before us: Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which entereth into that **within the veil**; whither the **forerunner** is for us entered, even Jesus, made an high priest after the order of Melchisedec." (Heb. 6:18-20).

We have been "begotten" by God to a living hope. "...Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, To an **inheritance** incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved **in heaven** for you." (1 Pet. 1:3-4). (See also Col. 1:5).

We have the promise of something better than we have here. "...For ye had compassion of me in my bonds, and took joyfully the spoiling of your goods, knowing in yourselves that ye have **in heaven a better and enduring**

substance.” (substance...“property, wealth-goods substance“, #5223 Strong).



(The following letter was sent to The Christian Courier in March, 1969, by Bro. Bill McCay, Sr., of Yakima, WA. It was written by the late Bro. G. Earl McCay, one of the early pioneers in the Lords work in the Pacific Northwest. **We feel it to be of unusually high merit and worthy of the consideration of all young (and old) Christians.** It was written shortly before Bro. McCay passed on to his eternal reward.

### MY LAST MESSAGE TO MY CHILDREN, GRAND-CHILDREN, AND GREAT-GRAND-CHILDREN

Realizing that no one can do any good after he leaves this world and desiring to do what good I can for my closest friends, which good may be with them after I am gone, I want to leave this last message. While much of the advice that one gives to younger people may seem at the time that it is given to be too strict it may do more good later. As Heb. 12:11 says, "Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby." If what I write may help you when you have time to carefully consider it I will feel that I have done some good.

One of the greatest dangers to persons may be the liability to drift with the crowd. That probably is the reason Heb. 2:1-2 was written. "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip, (The R. V. says, "lest we Drift away from them.") For if the word spoken by

*angels was steadfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompense of reward; How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation; which at first began to be spoken by the Lord and was confirmed unto us by them that heard Him; God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to his will?"* Association has a great influence on everybody. 1 Cor. 15:33, "Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners. So a person needs to be a leader and not only a follower so as to Lead the other ones.

But Paul would apply the principle to the work and worship of the church. 2 Cor. 11:3, "But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ," (subtlety; cunning) The forces of evil in the church are cunning, and because they are not really anxious to see people saved; but desire to

make a showing by getting as large a crowd as possible they will use all their cunning to change people from the simplicity in Christ to the errors of their religion. That probably was the reason for James 5:19-20, "*Brethren, if any of you do err from the truth, and one convert him; Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins.*"

While it is better not to err from the truth and to take off with a form of worship that is not taught in the Book; if a person has so erred it is better to quit that form of worship and come back to the "Old paths", Jer. 6:16, where all are safe. We must be careful not to say as Jeremiah said that some will say, "WE WILL NOT WALK THEREIN".

Popularity has a natural appeal to people. It is always pleasant to be with the large crowd; but when the Saviour was giving advice to his followers he told them that only a few would be saved while the great crowd would be lost. Never be ashamed to be with the small congregation if it is the one that is following God's word. Even if there are only two members in a community that are willing to worship as the scriptures teach, if they do so worship they have Christ's assurance that He will be there with them. You know that if we wish to be with Him eternally we want to make sure that we are with Him here. If we are careful to walk in the light of God's word in everything we do we have His assurance that we are having Christian fellowship (1 John 1:7).

But those who claim to have fellowship with God and do not walk in the light John


says they are "Liars" (verse 6), and it is certain that they will go to the wrong place (Rev. 21:8). If we want God with us in our life as well as our worship we must be careful not to go "*Beyond the teachings of Christ*" (2 John verse 9), and we must not encourage those who do go beyond His teachings or we are as bad as they (verse 10 of the same chapter). You know that if we wish to make sure of heaven we must be very careful of our life.

I cannot realize how awful it would be to spend eternity in Hell. But it certainly would be folly for anyone not to put forth every effort to escape it. The rich man did not want any of his brothers to come where he was (Luke 16:27). He should have used his influence while living to help his brothers go to the right place. So each of us must use our influence to help one other. It will be great if each one helping the other ones can help to bring All safely through the trials of this life and so enjoy the great reunion over there. I have confidence that you each will do that and win the Judge's approval. Will you try to meet me there? "Have faith in God." And never have a "*Heart of unbelief in turning back into the world*" as the children of Israel did.
